Nigeria: The Power of a Goat!

Mama Sarki is a middle aged widow in the town of Sabon Kamantan. She provided food and a place to sleep for our team while they drilled her village well.

Sounds simple. But here is the rest of the story. When Mama Sarki heard of the planned well project, she sold one of her three goats so that she could buy some rice and corn meal to feed the drill team.

When asked why she would sacrifice one of her goats she said "*the joy of not having to suffer in search of clean water is worth more than one of my goats*".

Haiti Hurricane Disaster Recovery

Last fall, hurricane Matthew battered Haiti with torrential rains and mud slides. Homes destroyed, wells flooded with contaminated water, and sewage backed up into watering holes where people draw their drinking water.

The force of water and mud caused 150 feet of security wall at the Lifewater compound to collapse onto a public roadway. Well production ground to a halt as the team cleared rubble and stood guard to keep out looters.

With your generous support, Lifewater Canada volunteers went to Haiti and rebuilt a reinforced security wall.

Liberians Smell and Taste

Despite challenges regarding expropriation of their compound, Lifewater Liberia was actually able to increase well production!

One of the wells was drilled in "Smell No Taste Town". This town is near the international airport. They could smell and see the luxury, but had no money to taste the food and lifestyles that came there.

For the rural poor, safe water is just a short distance below their feet, but they cannot taste it.
