The Year in Review

We are excited to report that the Liberian team drilled a record 15 wells during the year! These wells were drilled at orphanages, clinics and schools which drew unsafe water from rivers and swamps. "We were drinking from a pond near our village and that water caused problems for our children. Every time our children were dying from running stomach"

"You have saved us from sharing drinking water with the town's cattle and other animals by providing us some safe drinking water"

Philippines Geophysics

Lifewater helped a drilling crew in the Philippines by giving them a DC resistivity meter. Thanks Mike in the Yukon for building and donating it! The meter will help the team increase their drilling success rate by enabling them to interpret geological conditions and water table position before drilling.

El Salvador Water Testing

15 year old Jesse Hamilton met her high school volunteer hours requirement by traveling with a church group to El Salvador. She tested the quality of drinking water and found that half the samples had unsafe levels of bacteria. The group is now looking at starting a grass-roots business building small slow-sand filters.

Drill Manual In Spanish!

Earlier this year, we were received an e-mail from Panama asking for a Spanish copy of our drill manual to train local people. When they learned that it was only available in English, they translated the entire manual into Spanish! This translation was done by hand and is not yet available on the web.

Water Level Meters

50 water level meters were built for Lifewater. They will be used by teams in Asia, Africa and Central/South America to measure the amount of water in wells and assess the yield of newly drilled boreholes. Thanks Bill!

During the coming year, Lifewater is planning a trip back to Liberia. This trip is tentatively scheduled sometime between February and May 2003. During this period, the Liberian team will complete its **100th well!!!!** We

hope to be there to honour the crew, help dedicate the well and celebrate with the villagers all that the Lord has done in Liberia since we first began working there in 1995.

We are looking for someone to come along to obtain GPS coordinates for completed wells. This person would also use field test kits to confirm that well water is still safe to drink.

We could use a Contractor or Mason to help the team improve the quality of their cement pads.

We would like to have someone along who is able to take high quality slides and video. It would be wonderful to produce a new, high quality video chronicling all that has been done and capturing the 100th well celebration.

Finally, we need an accountant or business person to help the Liberian team learn business skills such as budgeting, estimating project costs, preparing annual reports, etc.

Other Goals for the Year

Angola: A group called Operation Blessing has a drill rig in Angola and needs help training their crew to start a water project there. Glenn Stronks and Jim Gehrels are willing to help do this if the country remains stable politically and logistical arrangements can be completed.

The purpose of his trip will be to help cap a spring that has the potential to provide an abundant supply of safe water to a local village.
